Italian artist Federico Massa (a.k.a. Iena Cruz) will participate to the 2022 edition of Waterford Walls Festival. Waterford Walls is Ireland's largest International Street Art Festival taking place for its 8th year from 12th to 21st August 2022. The Italian Institute of Culture, in collaboration with curator Cristina Ciampaglione, will support Iena Cruz's participation to the festival. Federico "Iena Cruz" Massa was born in Milan in 1981. In 2006 he graduated in Scenic Design at the Accademia di Belle Arti di Brera. He is a globally recognized muralist, contemporary artist and set designer. Through his murals, he depicts concepts concerning climate change, pollution risks and the problem of animal extinctions. "Michelangelo's Pietà Rondanini: the recent conservation history of a masterpiece" - Online lecture with prof. Lucia Toniolo

About 20 years ago the interest around the last sculpture by Michelangelo, was raised to the attention of the safeguard entities because of the project of a new exhibition site and a collaborative research project carried out under the responsibility of the Italian Ministry of Culture and the restorer company CBC. Subsequently, under the Normans' rule, Sicily underwent a period of great artistic and cultural development, which is reflected in the great monuments realized during that period. The island became a powerful reign and Palermo was its capital.
