





"LEARNING TO WRITE WITH GIUSEPPE PONTIGGI

SEMINAR WITH THE WRITER GUIDO CONTI IN THE CONTEXT OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE "ON THE 20TH ANNIVERSARY OF HIS DEATH

Giuseppe Pontiggia (1934-2003) has been one of the most renowned Italian writers of the late Twentieth Century. Amongst his work are novels, shorts stories and essays. Twenty years after his passing, an international conference organized by Marco Bellardi (UCD) and Bianca Rita Cataldi (UCD), seeks to celebrate the writer as an intellectual and explore new critical perspectives, as well as highlighting his profile within the anglophone context, where Pontiggia's work remains relatively obscure. The conference will be hosted by UCD from the 31st of August to the 1st September. Thanks to the Institute support, on Friday 1st at 6.30 pm the author and tutor Guido Conti will wrap up the event by presenting Pontiggia's career as an editor and writing teacher, delving on the theme of learning and writing in the context of Pontiggia's contribution.

The exhibition "Irish in Italy", curated by Antonio Bibbò (Trento University), will be launched on the first floor of the Italian Institute on the 7th of September. It illustrates the dissemination of Irish literature in Italy in the first half o the twentieth century and explores the complex relationship and interactions between the literary landscape and the political exchanges between the two nations. It also displays several important documents such as letters by Pavese, Montale, Yeats, Linati, as well as rare first editions of Irish literary works in Italian. The inauguration of the exhibition coincides with the launch of the first edition of FIILI 2023, organized by the Institute in collaboration with Irish PEN, Literature Ireland, Trinity College Dublin Italian Department, and Centre for Literary and Cultural Translation, Society of Italian Studies and curated by Enrica Ferrara and Catherine Dunne.

FILM SCREENING OF "I SOLITI IGNOTI" by MARIO MONICELLI (1958)

The Institute is delighted to host a new series of "Lunedì al Cinema" this Autumn, with two underlying themes: Comedy and Politics, which will take turn illustrating the history of Italy. From September to December we will screen movies that will explore the beginnings and rise to fame of commedia all'italiana, from the '50s to 2000, tackling social themes linked to the biographies of well-known public figures. We will start on the 11th of September with the screening of "I soliti ignoti" by Mario Monicelli (1958), universally recognized as the precursor of the genre. The movie features actors and actresses like Totò, Marcello Mastroianni, Vittorio Gassman, Claudia Cardinale etc. It will be screened in Italian with English subtitles, introduced by an analysis of the context and the Director's work.



THE "YEARS OF LEAD"

Terrorism in Italy (1969-1988) Encounter with Chiara Tedaldi (UCD)

This talk by Dr. Chiara Tedaldi (UCD) provides an introduction to left and right-wing terrorism during the 1970's and '80s in Italy; a type of political violence rooted in the emergence of extra-parliamentary movements supported by paramilitary organisations. The talk's main objective is to foster a broader reflection on this period, marked by such a large number of bombings, assassinations, mutilations, and kidnappings (14,615) that it is commonly referred to as the 'Years of Lead'. The talk also touches on state-prescribed engagement with the legacy of terrorism, focusing on the increasingly prominent role played by the relatives of the victims in shaping the people's understanding of this traumatic past. NOBEL PRIZE WINNER LIVE RITA LEVI-MONTALCINI

The Institute programme will keep the focus on exploring the lives of Italian people who paid a great service to our country. After the meeting on Mario Tchou and Olivetti and the celebration of the scientific discoveries by Giulio Natta, who won a Nobel prize in chemistry in 1963, this month's encounter will be centred upon the neurologist, scientist and winner of 1986 Nobel Prize in Medicine Rita Levi-Montalcini. Amongst her several recognitions, he was the first woman to be admitted to Pontifical Academy of science. During the evening we will assist to the screening of the film "Rita Levi-Montalcini" (2020), in Italian with subtitles. As an introduction, Dr. Daniela Tropea, Associate Professor at Trinity Institute of Neurosciences (TCIN), will discuss in English the life and achievements of Levi-Montalcini. Free admission.


