Lunedì al cinema LIVE Screening of the movie "Il Capitale umano" (2013) by Paolo Virzì In Italian with English subtitles



Following the success of the first live screening of the new cycle "Lunedì al Cinema", on Monday 3rd October we will watch together "Il Capitale umano" ("Human Capital", 2013) by Paolo Virzì. The movie tells the stories of two families that interweave and collides on Christmas Eve day, in a small village of Brianza, in Northern Italy. Family dynamics and financial interests reveal unexpected secrets and vulnerabilities. Loosely based on Stephen Amidon's thriller set in Connecticut, the film won 6 Nastri d'Argento and 7 David di Donatello.

"A Real Phantasmagoria"
Lecture "Giambattista Belzoni's
Egyptian Tomb, from Perfect
Facsimile to First-Person Experience"
In English



In 1821, the Paduan pioneer archaeologist Giambattista Belzoni opened, at the Egyptian Hall in London, the exhibit "The Tomb", a life-size "perfect facsimile" of two rooms from the burial place of Pharaoh Psammis (Seti I) meticulously reproduced by Belzoni via a series of drawings, watercolors, plaster, and wax impressions taken onsite. A 3D model and interactive simulation of Belzoni's Tomb is now included in the digital monograph "Shadow Plays: Virtual Realities in an Analogue World" (Stanford University Press, 2022) by Prof. Massimo Riva (Brown University). In this lecture at the Italian Institute of Culture, together with Trinity College Dublin, M. Riva will reconnect Belzoni's Egyptian Tomb to a series of 18th-19th century optical devices such as the "mondo nuovo" or pantoscope, the magic lantern, the phantasmagoria, the moving panorama, and the stereoscope, all foreshadowing the immersive experiences of our digital times. A few minutes before the show begins, each "actor" is given a police uniform and a headset device. When the curtain rises, the "actors" must meticulously carry out the orders they are given over the earphones. These commands are received individually. Each policeman learns his orders in real time. Each action is to be done within the time defined by the order. This is the visionary and apocalyptic plot of "Bros" by Romeo Castellucci, a recognized Italian theatre director and set designer. In the early 13th century, Leonardo Pisano, later known as Fibonacci, published his "Liber Abbaci", introducing Indo-Arabic numerals and the first calculation algorithms essential to the merchants of the era.
